DIRECTOR OF CYBERSECURITY

DEPARTMENT: Academics

CLASSIFICATION: Exempt – Full Time; Grant Funded x 3 years

SALARY: \$80,000

FUNCTION: To provide quality instruction and academic advisement to all students enrolled at Clinton College. Full Time Professors/Instructors are to motivate each student to participate in all class activities so that he or she may achieve to their maximum potential.

REPORTS TO: Division Chair for Science and Technology

MAJOR DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Keeps accurate records of all student grades, attendance, and other required reports.
- Demonstrate fair and impartial evaluations for all students enrolled in course(s).
- Prepares and maintains all final grade reports for students.
- Meets scheduled classes.
- Prepares a syllabus for each class annually.
- Distributes syllabus to students on the first day of class.
- Participates in the Faculty Council.
- Mentors and advises students.
- Participates in academic committees.
- Carries out special assignments that are requested by Academic Dean.
- Identifies and provides any special needs or accommodations required by students.
- Ability to provide direction regarding the development, evaluation, and implementation of information system security programs.
- Patience of working with adult students and teaching them techniques and providing technical knowledge regarding protection against cyber attacks.
- Willingness to learn about regularly about the latest hacking techniques and newest vulnerabilities in computer systems.
- Assist students with developing strategies and skills to protect against threats to a company or organization's computers.
- Develop curriculum, creating learning materials, and assessing students' progress and skills.
- Responsible for teaching classes.
- Actively pursue grants and have interest in research.

MINIMUM EDUCATION REQUIRED:

- A master's degree from an accredited institution required or 18 credit hours in graduate courses related to the subject matter if the master's is not in the subject matter taught.
- Demonstrated expertise in the teaching field through evidence such as national or international awards, publications in professional journals, competitive grants, certifications, licenses, or other outstanding professional recognition.
- Doctoral degree from an accredited institution is preferred.
- Master's degree, an equivalent degree, or equivalent professional experience.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS/SKILLS:

- Strong interpersonal skills with students.
- Ability to work as a team member and supervise others.
- Poise and ability to act calmly and competently in high-pressure, high-stress situations.
- Knowledge of disaster recovery, computer forensic tools, technologies, and methods.
- Knowledge of various security technologies, protocols, and implementations.
- Knowledge and understanding of information security concepts and best practices.
- Proficient in Microsoft Office and other computer software/databases.
- Detail-oriented with strong organizational skills.
- Management experience.
- Willing to earn a cybersecurity certification within 1 year of employment if applicable.
- Work experience in the computers, information technology and/or security fields.
- High aptitude for math.
- Great detection skills.
- Experience working on and maintaining computer equipment.
- Strong analytical and problem-solving skills.
- Proficient with Microsoft Office Suite or related software.
- The ability to multitask.
- Industry related experience.
